## Scrap Bag

This request came to us recently through the website. If you're interested in helping, please contact Evie Scott directly.


My name is Evie Scott and I work for MEANS Database. We're a non-profit database that focuses on helping other non-profit organizations access supplies to serve those in need. Recently we received a donation of 27-inch fabric squares from Lush Cosmetics because they had a surplus when making masks for their employees. Currently, my coworker, Kenna, is in the possession of the fabric squares.

We would like to donate the masks to LA Cloud 9, but have no way of making the masks ourselves. Would Santa Monica Quilt Guild be willing to make masks to donate to LA Cloud 9?

Fabric will be provided, and any additional costs you may have for materials for the masks (i.e. thread, bias tape, elastic) will be covered, as will shipping to LA on Cloud 9. As I said, each fabric square is 27x27 inches. They can make one or two masks each, depending on the pattern used. We're asking individuals to sign up per 50 masks. If you're comfortable in making additional sets, wonderful, please make that notation when you send your information! Once you have decided on the number, please send me that total and your mailing address; Kenna will get the fabric shipped to you via the US Postal Service.

Please let me know if you have any way of making masks to serve LA Cloud 9 or if you have any questions.
