## SMQG 2018 Quilting Retreat

Our Retreat for 2018 is scheduled for March 23-25 at the Mary and Joseph Retreat Center in Palos Verdes. It's close to home and allows us the opportunity to opt for an overnight package or a day commuter package. The grounds are lovely, lush and green with lots of walking paths to wander. We can park near the Lounge meeting room, and moving our sewing machines and supplies will be easy.

The 2018 costs approved by the Retreat Center Board include 6 meals for overnight guests, starting with Friday dinner:

Overnight guests (Friday & Saturday nights)  
double occupancy - \$315 each person  
single - \$395

Day sewers - \$30 per day plus any meals taken in the dining room: continental breakfast \$6, breakfast \$10, lunch \$16, dinner \$22 (note that you are not required to pay for meals, but outside catering cannot be brought in - brown bag lunches are OK). Let Lani Hee know on the Final Payment/release of claims form, which will be handed out at the February Guild meeting.

We can check-in to the sewing room as early as 9:00am on Friday and depart as late as 4:00pm on Sunday. Bedroom check-in is 4pm on Friday. Bedroom check-out is at 10am on Sunday.

The Retreat Center will provide coffee and tea service and snacks, but you can bring your favorite snacks and wine if you so desire. I will bring bottled water. Just think...three full days of sewing, sewing, sewing!

Members can bring their finished items to show and tell.

Deposits for the retreat in March were accepted at the meeting. Please contact Lani Hee as soon as possible as the retreat will fill early. Let Lani know if you plan to stay overnight or just attend for the day. The Mary and Joseph Retreat center is in Palos Verdes, so it's close enough to join just for the day.

Membership reported that we currently have 53 paid members.

The January meeting will be sewing for philanthropy. The room will be open beginning at 3pm, and stay open until 9pm. Please bring your machine, iron, and ironing board. Also bring any extra batting or spray baste that you can donate. You are welcome to bring your own dinner, or the group may order pizza delivery (depending on what the attendees decide at the meeting).

The Opportunity Quilt will be displayed at the Road to California show at the Ontario Convention Center in January. This show allows us to sell tickets for the Opportunity quilt. Several members have signed up to be white glove hostesses, as this is required to allow us to sell tickets. Kennalee asked everyone to buy more tickets, as the sales are still less than \$1,000.

Also at Road to California, there will be a guild attendance challenge. If you go to the show, make sure you sign in as a member of the guild. The guild with the highest number of attendees will get a \$500 donation. Since the winning is based on a percentage, we still have a chance despite other guilds that have bus trips to the show.

Katherine Small attended the meeting with her daughter. She will be 100 years old in January, and she's still quilting!

The rest of the meeting was a raffle where everyone attending received a prize. Thank you to those that donated prizes.

Sewing Arts staff donated a tape measure to everyone.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30pm.

**Art Quilts Exhibit opens at Santa Monica's California Heritage Museum**

An exhibit of 64 contemporary art quilts opens with a free artist reception on Friday, December 8. The reception is open to the public from 6 to 9:30 pm. The juried exhibition includes the work of 49 California and Nevada artists who are members of SAQA (Studio Art Quilt Associates), an international organization of artists working in fabric. The exhibition will continue through March 18, 2018, and will be open Wednesday through Sunday, from 10 am to 4 pm. The California Heritage Museum is located at 2612 Main Street, in Santa Monica.

SAQA was founded in 1989, as a non-profit organization with the mission of promoting art quilts and fabric art through education, exhibitions, and publications. Most of the quilts on display will be offered for sale, and an exhibition catalog will be available in the museum gift shop.




# Perkiomen Valley Block

## Thomas Fire Relief Quilts

Thank you for joining us to give comfort to those who have endured the Thomas Fire.





7 – 4 1/2"  
Squares  
4 Dark  
3 Light

4 – 5"  
Squares  
2 Dark  
2 Light

Draw a diagonal line on the back of both of the 5" light squares.

Place 1 of the light square on a 5" dark square, right sides together, and sew a scant 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn line.

Cut on drawn line for to create 2 half-square triangles, measuring 4 1/2". Repeat with other set. You will end up with 4 half-square triangles (you only need 2, so you will have enough to make another block.)



Sew pieces together as illustrated using 1/4" seam allowance.
