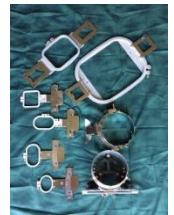

Meeting Minutes

SMQG Meeting Minutes April 4, 2018

President Maureen opened the meeting, and asked if there were any visitors.

Anne Wallace brought her mother, Betsy Ross.

Mark showed a quilt by Nadine Kirk that he quilted on his longarm.

A motion was made to approve the minutes as printed in the newsletter. Barbara Spielberg made the motion, and it was seconded by Pam Overton. The motion was approved by voice vote.

A motion was made to approve the treasurer's report as printed in the newsletter. Bobbie Blake made the motion and Pam Overton seconded. The motion was approved by voice vote.

There were no reports from the Board, the treasurer, or the website.

Kennalee said that Marilyn Vredevoe had rejoined the guild.

Olivia Carnahan gave out ribbon bracelets to members who had completed a UFO.

She said that in May there will be a free table, where members can bring in fabric, tools, or books they no longer need, and exchange them for what others have brought. She encouraged everyone to bring items for the exchange. (The free table will be separate from the Ways and Means table).

Olivia also asked that in June, everyone should bring in blocks that will be sewn into charity quilts at the January sew-in.

Membership reports that there are 61 members.

Pam Overton had no report for the newsletter.

Philanthropy is asking for gently used clothing for Aviva, so that their clients will have clothes appropriate for job interviews. They will accept clothing for men or women.

Sue Barrett said that there will be a trunk show by Frances Moore in May. In June, there will be a trunk show presented by Maureen Gardner.

Pam asked the members to fill out ballots to vote for the workshops they want for August, September, and October. These teachers offer several workshops, and members were given a choice of workshops.

Maureen asked if some members would be interested in having a half-day workshop during the afternoon before the meeting. Members indicated by a show of hands that there was interest in this option.

Lani reported that the retreat went well. Everyone had a great time, and she is already working on the retreat for next year.

June 2 is the date for the trunk show celebrating Kathryn Small. The celebration will be at the Church of Latter-Day Saints on Centinela. Maureen asked for volunteers to help set up, serve food, and clean-up.

The Meet the Teacher event will be on April 14 at the Carson Community Center. SMQG will be having a sale of donated fabric at the event. Kennalee will be onsite by 8:30am, and she will need help unloading her car and setting up the booth. She already has 35 banker's boxes of fabric, and the prices will be cheap. The sale begins at 9am. Volunteers who help Kennalee will also get the chance to see the teachers make their presentations.

After the break, Larry Gonzalez spoke about textile care for antiques, as well as preparing our new quilts to avoid care issues later.

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If you were here, you'd be sewing!

A native Angeleno, Kate Small was born one hundred years ago in the City of Angels and spent most of her life here. She did leave to get her Bachelor's degree at Berkeley and then to Kentucky, to marry her fiancé, Ted Small, as he was about to head out to serve as a fighter pilot during World War !!.

Over the years, Kathryn raised three children, helped Ted create a haute couture women's clothing business under the name of Edith Small, and became active in many community organizations. She also followed her creative instincts and learned many crafts, one of which led her to the most satisfying – quilting.

One day in the 1980s, on her way home from a welding class (yes, welding), where she created artworks with a blowtorch - Kate stopped at a donut shop in Santa Monica. She spotted a shop nearby with a sign overhead that read "Crazy Ladies and Friends." Her curiosity led her to what became her passion for the rest of her life. It was a quilt store, owned by an inspirational teacher and author, Mary Ellen Hopkins. Within 2 days of her first class, Kate had a quilt top done and she was on her way. Blow torch gone, sewing machine front and center!

In the fifteen years she worked at and hung out at the store, she developed a very distinctive style of putting fabrics together that others would not have tried. She is known for using unusual fabrics in unusual ways. When Mary Ellen would order a print that everyone would gasp in horror at, Kate would smile, take it home and bring it back a few days later in a finished quilt top which was fantastic! Needless to say, the fabric flew out of the store and others dared to use it. This was Kate's intended plan, after all.

Her quiet wit and creative mind have kept her active and productive all these years. Besides quilting, she still does the Sunday New York Times crossword puzzle – in ink!

Kate's quilts can be seen in several of Mary Ellen's books (particularly "Log Cabin Notebook" available from Amazon) and in a new photographic book of her entire collection created by her son-in-law, artist David Em (www.davidem.com).
