Whale Charity Block instructions for Unit 5

Cut:


Piece Letter	Piece Size in Inches	Piece Color
a	2 ½ x 5 ½	pastel
b	2 ½ x 5 ½	pastel
c	4 ½ x 2 ½	white
d	4 ½ x 3 ½	white
e	4 ½ x 3 ½	white

Construct as follows:

1. Sew pieces **a** and **b** together and press.
2. Sew piece **c** to bottom right to create a rectangle corner. (See previous instructions or use your own method for quick triangle corners.)
3. Sew piece **d** to the top right to make another rectangle triangle corner.

Note that these two triangle corners should overlap at the seam allowance on the right hand edge.

4. Sew piece **e** to the top of the Unit. You are done!
