Thank you all for supporting Ways & Means.



You can also make simpler blocks (stars, 4 or 9-patches, etc.) to integrate with the whale blocks at our "community sew-in" in January. Just be sure to use a light background that will blend in with our pastel whales.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR UNITS 6 & 7

For Unit 6 Cut

Piece	Piece Size in Inches	Piece
Letter		Color
а	14-1/2 by 1-1/2	white
b	3-1/2 by 1-7/8; cut into 2 triangles	white
С	3 by 1-7/8; cut into 2 triangles	pastel
d	2 by 2 (square) cut into 2 triangles	pastel
е	2 by 2 (square) cut into 2 triangles	white
f	15-1/2 by 1-1/2	white

To construct Unit 6

- 1. Place one triangle **b** and one triangle **c** right sides together, offsetting the pieces by ¼ inch at the ends (don't match their end points). Sew along the long angled side. Press the seam open and trim to a 2 ½inch by 1 ½ inch unit.
- 2. Sew one triangle **d** and one triangle **e** together along the long angled side. Press and trim to a 1 ½ square.
- 3. Sew **b/c** to **d/e**.
- 4. Add piece a to the left side of the new unit (b/c/e/e) and piece f to the right side.

For Unit 7 Cut:

Piece	Piece Size in Inches	Piece

а	2-1/2 by 1-1/2	white
b	3 by 3 (square) cut into 2 triangles	white
С	3 by 3 (square) cut into 2 triangles	pastel
d	Cut two: 2-1/2 by 3-1/2	pastel
е	Cut four: 1-1/2 by 1-1/2 squares	white

f	Cut two: 1-/78 by 1-7/8 squares;	pastel
	cut each square into triangles	
g	Cut two: 1-/78 by 1-7/8 squares;	white
	cut each square into triangles	
h	1-1/2 by 4-1/2	white
i	5-1/2 by 3-1/2	white

To Construct Unit 7

- Sew one triangle b and one triangle c together along the long angled side. Press and trim to a unit 2-1/2 inches square. Repeat to make another unit. Sew the units together.
- 2. Add piece **a** to top and bottom of unit **b/c**.
- 3. Use fast corner method to sew piece **e** to piece **d** twice. See picture of unit 7 for placement on both pieces.
- 4. Sew the two **e/d** units together. Watch the placement. It forms the wide part of the tail.
- Sew one triangle f to triangle g together along the long angled side. Press and trim to 1-1/2 inches square. Repeat to make another unit but this time place the squares in the opposite corners.
- 6. Sew **f/g** units to **h** on top and bottom checking placement with picture of unit 7.
- 7. Sew a/b/c unit to left side of d/e. Sew f/g/h to right side of d/e. Press.
- 8. Sew i to the top to complete unit 7.
