I made a polka dot top in jelly roll fashion for the FMC prayer quilt. They are not exact 2.5" strips but with a little fudging –maybe a wider seam here and a slightly narrower one there and readjustments made after ironing the top, when the seam looked like 1/16". There are still many strips left for pick up at our July hybrid meeting (tbd).

Sorry to those unable to come to the meeting. We filled the "alcove" of Simkins Hall with busy and merry noise; we worked from 3:30-8:30 and made several tops for the prayer group, and sandwiched quilts for our other donations. To those working from home, we have numerous orphan blocks that may inspire a philanthropy quilt or two. These will be available at the next in person meeting. Mariana will be accepting all donations and we look forward to a later report.

I am still inspired as I need to finish my great-nephew's graduation quilt. I think I have the design and fabrics under control and will finish it soon. I also took another top for machine quilting and that will need binding when it is done. I am making slow progress I think but it is moving forward.
