"At Least Feel Happiness: the dao of quilting"

In my improvisational quilt design, I try to focus more on the process and less on the product. I like to think

of the bias tape lines as brush strokes, in the spirit of a Chinese calligraphy course I once took. The teacher asked us to focus only on the practice of writing, and not on the words we were trying to write. He explained that every character begins with a single brush stroke, and if you empty your mind you will feel the dao in that stroke... the natural order of the universe and the moral path of our one shared humanity. I guess we all must have looked confused or skeptical in response, because then he laughed and said, "At least feel happiness, OK?" In this lecture, I will discuss my path to finding happiness in the quilting process through each quilt that taught me to stop thinking and just look around.

(doors open 30 minutes prior for set-up)

Emily will teach us how to use bias-tape applique to create a graphic and illustrated quilt design. You have a choice of purchasing and using Emily's brand new Jungle Boogie pattern, or come ready to create your own design.

SMQG General Meeting Minutes – April 6 2022

SMQG Quilt guild members gathered at First United Methodist Church and on Zoom for its April 2022 general meeting. The meeting was called to order by President Aileen Cooke at 7:00 pm. It was a hybrid meeting; the first since the pandemic began.

Business Meeting:

The President, Aileen Cooke, called approval of the March 2022 Minutes and Treasurer's report as

published in the April 2022 newsletter. Both were approved by acclamation.

Aileen reminded members of the guild fabric sale at the Quilt House on Saturday, April 30.

At this point in the meeting, Laurie introduced the evening speaker Diane Harris of Nebraska who gave a well-received presentation "Make Extraordinary Scrap Quilts" via zoom. She also promised guild members she would send pdf handouts of her lecture.

Committee Reports:

Membership: Sheila reported there are currently 57 members and the membership roster has been posted on the guild website.

Vice President: Allison placed sets of blocks made by various members during the pandemic. They were invited to take a set and make placemats for philanthropy or a quilt for philanthropy. She said the Council will have a Meet the Teachers meeting on April 8. Pam will send a link to members who would like to attend via zoom.

Newsletter: Pam continued to invite member submissions to the newsletter.

Philanthropy: Bobbie and Luann have received 300 placemats to date. With the additional placemats turned in at the meeting, they will have the 350 needed to deliver to Meals on Wheels. Keep them coming as there are other nonprofit groups who need them. Philanthropy quilts are always welcome.

Program and Workshops: Laurie reported that at the May meeting speaker will be Dana Jones and the June speaker will be Tara Miller. She continues to encourage members to send her speaker suggestions and thanked those who have done so.

Ways and Means and Hospitality: No report.

Website: Emily thanked all those who helped set up the evening's first hybrid meeting. She apologized for any quirks that happened at the beginning of the meeting.

Old Business: Aileen reported that the guild had a small group for our first Zoom sew in and a larger

group for a happy hour. More will be scheduled but suggestions of days and times are needed to best attract a larger group of members.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:54 p.m.
