President's Corner

The oncologist who helped start the Ronald McDonald Houses for families with children receiving cancer treatment died recently. She was 97. From the October 8-9, 2022 Wall Street Journal:

"The oncologist, Audrey Evans, headed a cancer department at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. When a representative of the Philadelphia Eagles football team delivered her a check to support the department, Dr. Evans mentioned her idea for a way to spare family members from sleeping in hospital lobbies and subsisting on vending machine snacks.

The Eagles agreed that their quarterback, Roman Gabriel, could appear in TV commercials for [the McDonald's shamrock] milkshakes if part of the proceeds went to creating the guesthouse. The McDonald's franchises agreed to turn over all the profits from the promotion if the home could be named in honor of their clown mascot."

The first Ronald McDonald House opened in 1974, in Philadelphia and now the chain extends to 380 Ronald McDonald Houses around the world.

Our local Ronald McDonald House receives quilts from the Santa Monica Quilt Guild and has been part of our philanthropy program. Quilts of any size are appreciated. We thank our members for being so supportive.

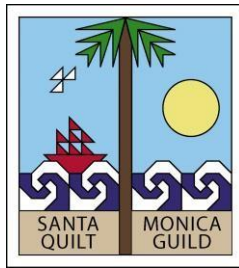
