Students in LAUSD and Santa Monica schools are back in class. Before you know it, the holidays will be here and thankfully cooler weather. The recent Hillary storm left us 3.6" of rain in the backyard.

I'm using some unfinished tops to make coverlets, a top, a back, no lining, for Maui charities. They go together quickly and are good in an area like Hawaii. I plan to send a check as well. Most agencies prefer that and can purchase what is needed most.

Two weeks ago, I was north of Vancouver Island at a salmon fishing resort/camp. I managed not to go with hubby for many years but had to try it this year. It's a bit of a family event with my Seattle relatives joining us. The area is beautiful with numerous forested islands and wildlife in addition to all the fish. It's common to see Hump backed whales rise to the surface and see spouts and backs. Last year my family saw the whales create these bubble vortexes that corral smaller fish (I hope not the salmon) then the whales swoop up dinner. I bet there is a YouTube video on this which I will have to search for later. One can learn anything on YouTube and Google.

The resort, Ole's, was started by a logging family and is built atop a former barge* with 24 guest rooms, a dining room with a full commercial kitchen, chef and staff, hot tub, and numerous lounging chairs. Great meals are served and cookies and snacks to take out while fishing. The barge is in an ideal spot—tied between two islands surrounded by a cove. People can start fishing (2-3 people/boat) at 5:30 or 6 AM and fish all day. We usually stopped for lunch and dinner and rested for the evening. I only awoke early as my roommate wanted to start fishing then but I had a more leisurely breakfast. We caught fish but few caught their limit. The fish won this time.

*Because of winter storms, the barge gets towed to a storage point in the fall until summer comes around.

SMQG General Meeting Minutes

August 2, 2023

SMQG Quilt guild members met on zoom for its August 2023 general meeting. The meeting was called to order by president Aileen Cooke at 7:00 pm. She thanked Vice President Allison Leong for conducting the meeting at the July potluck.

<u>Business Meeting</u>: Aileen Cooke called for approval of the July 2023 Minutes and Treasurer's report as published in the August 2023 newsletter. Both were approved by acclamation.

At this point in the meeting, substituting for Laurie (who was volunteering at Camp Turtle), Aileen introduced the evening speaker, Lori De Jarnett, who presented her lecture, "Re-runs, Quilts inspired by the Past" which was well received.

Additional nominations were opened to the membership present, especially for co-chairs for Programs, Philanthropy and Newsletter. None were offered. The slate will be published in the September newsletter and a vote from the membership will be

taken at the September meeting. Aileen thanked the committee for their diligence and hard work.

Treasurer: Kennalee shared the following report on the July 29 fabric sale: Sales totaled \$2,183.13, including \$743 in credit card sales. After deducting \$20.75 in credit card fees and \$171 state sales tax, net profit was \$2,183.13. A sewing machine was also sold. Kennalee thanked those who helped with the set up and take down for the sale. There will be more quilt kits for sale on the website as well as 5 or so large plastic bins on sale for \$5 each.

<u>Vice President</u>: Allison indicated all her information is in the August newsletter. She also reminded members who have not yet done so, submit their not-so-secret president's gift to her by the September meeting.

<u>Philanthropy</u>: Marianna delivered all the quilts received at the July meeting. Pam indicated that the Venice Family Clinic also could use toiletries.

<u>Program and Workshops</u>: Information on future speakers will be in the September newsletter.

Ways and Means: No report.

<u>Website</u>: Emily will be sending out email to guild members inviting them to set up their personal password. At the last SCCQG meeting the speaker for the day discussed issues many websites are having with security. One of the recommendations was for quilt guilds that have a "members only" page, access by each member should be with their personal password rather than one password for all guild members. Emily will provide full instructions for members to set up their individual passwords.
